We salute our Honorary Italians and Our beautiful queens who have reigned each year.



NETTUNO is a town located on the water-front at 38 miles from Rome.

The town is very important for the tourism infact many visitors are coming to see it, the most interesting and historical monuments are: Torre Astura, Borgo Medievale, Castello Sangallo. Dans le centre touristique Scacciapensieri (hotel, restaurants, piscine couverte, bowling) s'eleve le grattaciel de NETTUNO.



Sicily-Rome American Cemetery and Memorial



Location

The Sicily-Rome American Cemetery and Memorial is situated just east of Anzio at the north edge of the town of Nettuno, 38 miles/60 kilometers south of Rome.

Site

The site, 77 acres in extent, lay in the zone of advance of the U.S. 3d Infantry Division. A temporary wartime cemetery was established there on 24 January 1944, two days after the U.S. VI Corps landing on the beaches of Anzio.

After World War II, when the temporary cemeteries were disestablished by the Army, the remains of American Military Dead whose next-of-kin requested permanent interment overseas were moved to one of the fourteen permanent sites on foreign soil, usually the one which was closest to the temporary cemetery. There they were reinterred by the American Graves Registration Service in the distinctive grave patterns proposed by the cemetery's architect and approved by the Commission. Design and construction of all structures and facilities at the permanent sites as well as the sculpture, landscaping and other improvements were the responsibility of the Commission.

Many of the Dead interred or commemorated here gave their lives in the liberation of Sicily (10 July to 17 August 1943); in the landings in the Salerno area (9 September 1943) and in the subsequent heavy fighting northward; in the landings at and occupation of the Anzio beachhead (22 January 1944 to May 1944); and in the air and naval operations in these regions.

The permanent cemetery and memorial were completed in 1956.

At home in Pittsburgh, Tom is a featured vocalist with The Benny Benack Orchestra, also he occasionally performs in several private clubs in the area.



ANNUAL BELLOSGUARDO REUNION PICNIC

In some instances, five family generations exist in the above group picture taken at the Washington Park Stone Pavilion in Washington, Pa. on July 25, 1986. Adults attending total 242 and children numbered 44. This picnic reunion is held every year; a tradition that has been honored for the past 55 years and apparently will continue for many more years. The first reunion was held at the late Mr. & Mrs. Guy Tucci's farm at Vance Station near Washington, Pa. in 1932; later at Forrest Villa, then Cabana Beach in Bridgeville, Pa.

Very few persons representing the first generation are still living, possibly five persons who originally pooled their meager resources in the small community of Bellosguardo, Italy, Province of Salemo located some distance below Rome. In those days during 1903 or 1905, it took around fourteen days to cross the Atlantic which was not too particularly pleasant, but, what helped was that they were told that "the pavements were paved in gold." In a sense, that was true, but it took possibly thirty or forty years to reach that pleasureable period of independence after landing in Washington, Pa., Canonsburg, Pittsburgh, Bridgeville and other locations nearby.

So, again this year another reunion takes place shortly where all will enjoy Italian festivities such as Italian music, dancing, conversations, games for the children, picture taking and above all, Italian food preparations. Representatives of most of the families usually attending are as follows: the Sorice Family, Definis, Valitutti, D'Alessandro, Cappozzoli, Merlo, Nicolella, Raffaeli, Croce, Musto, Luongo, Resiniti, Mazza, Tucci, Pepe, Macchiaroli, Palamone, Marroni and apologies for those unaccounted for by a member of the second generation.

A Delectable Italian Delight "Takes The Cake"

Where there's romance in the air, the occasion calls for an appropriate dessert and what could be more suitable than an "Italian Love Cake".

After all, who knows more about love than the Italians? St. Valentine - the patron of lovers - was a Roman. Romeo and Juliet were Verona. And Amaretto di Saronno - the drink of love - is from Saronno. It was there that a beautiful young woman created an intriguing liqueur for the man she loved 458 years ago.

With such credentials, it would seem that the Italians know what love is all about. We could even say they "take the

cake".

In this case, the cake is an irresistable concoction just pefect for anniversaries, engagements, birthdays, showers and of

course St. Valentine's Day.

Keeping in mind the white, red and green of the Italian flag, an American angel food cake has been substituted for the traditional sponge cake that would be used in Italy. Add to this a sprinkling of Amaretto and layers of strawberry and pistachio ice cream. Top it all off with a cloud of whipped cream and chocolate hearts.

This is certainly a dessert created to foster and sustain any romance! Just follow the easy recipe below.

1 large angel food cake ½ cup Amaretto Liqueur 1 pint pistachio ice cream

1 pint strawberry ice cream
2 cups (1 pint) heavy cream
6 ounces (1 package) semisweet real chocolate
morsels

With a sharp serrated knife using a sawing motion, cut the cake into three layers. Sprinkle layers with 6 tablespoons of the Amaretto. Place on layer on a serving platter. Cut ice cream into slices and place pistachio ice cream on bottom layer. Top with second layer and a layer of strawberry ice cream. Top with third cake layer. Place in freezer.

In a bowl, mix heavy cream and remaining Amaretto and beat until very thick. Frost the sides and top of the cake and replace in freezer. Melt chocolate over very low heat until smooth. Spread chocolate in a 1/4-inch thick layer on foil and

chill until chocolate hardens.

With a small cookie cutter, cut hearts out of chocolate and place on top of cake. Freeze cake until ready to serve. Makes one 9-inch cake.

Sarah's Garden Fettuccine Salad

1/2 cup salad or vegetable oil
Grated peel of 1 lemon
Juice of 1-1/2 lemons (4-1/2 tablespoons)
2 tablespoons white wine vinegar
2 tablespoons toasted sesame seed

l large clove garlic, minced ½ teaspoon onion salt

8 ounces fettuccine noodles, cooked and drained (about 5 cups cooked)

1/2 pound small cooked shrimp

1 bunch or 1 package (10-ounces) fresh spinach, washed and cut into thin strips

2 medium carrots, shredded

1 unpeeled medium zucchini, shredded

2 green onions (scallions), cut in thin strips

2 to 4 tablespoons chopped cilantro

Fresh ground black pepper to taste

In a large bowl, combine oil, lemon peel, lemon juice, vinegar, sesame seed, garlic and onion salt. Add noodles and shrimp; toss well. Cover and chill for 2 hours or longer; stir occasionally. To serve, add remaining ingredients, toss well. Makes 8 servings.

ANGELO'S RISTORANTE

In March of 1939, Angelo and Giacomina Passalacqua opened a small neighborhood tavern at 955 West Chestnut St. With Rt. 40 being a major highway at the time, the place became popular for travelers and area workers. As more and more people frequented the tavern, Angelo and Jenny (English for Giacomina) began serving Italian spaghetti and fresh bread, so, fittingly, the tavern became known as the West Chestnut Spaghetti Inn. As they slowly leaned more towards a restaurant than a tavern, Angelo added a separate dinning room to accommodate their customers with good food and friendly service.

Angelo passed away in 1953 and Jenny ran the business with her children helping her. In 1957 the business was turned over to her son, Silvio, and her daughter, Carmellina De Stefano. Together they ran the business for 27 years. During those years they changed the name to Angelo's, in memory of their father, and Angelo's became the most popular restaurant in town with the restaurant growing every year.

In 1981 Silvio became the sole proprietor and two of his three children joined the business to become the third generation of Passalacquas to operate Angelo's Restaurant.

So, nowadays when you stop by Angelo's, you'll be greeted by Silvio and his wife Patty, his son Michael or his daughter Tonne. And since 1981 the restaurant has taken on many changes in personality as well. In addition to traditional Italian foods, Angelo's now serves Cajun style dishes, imaginative veal and delectable seafoods, along with modern cuisine of all types. Angelo's boasts 25 wines by the glass and a dessert tray filled with homemade pastries.

The Passalacqua family has directly operated the restaurant in the same location for 47 years and while the food and atmosphere have changed, some things have never changed. It's still a family business and it's still run the same as when Angelo and Jenny first opened the doors, with good food and friendly service, and the Passalacqua family plans to keep it that way, after all, it's a family tradition.
